FW noted that knowing who's handling the data and what will be done with it is a key point and would be important for students to know.

JL agreed with the points raised. It's not yet determined who will be running this research yet.

JL noted that we want to ensure that we avoid survey fatigue with this as well to ensure that we get robust data from it. It may be included as part of other surveys that are run throughout the year.

DT agreed with the points raised. It's important to build that trust in the data and the research.



AOD noted that having it as a separate survey to other survey's would be important. Students may not want to share that data if it's part of another survey.

JL noted that the biggest challenge is anonymity. In the wellbeing survey this isn't anonymous whereas we would want this survey to be anonymous. The challenge is driving the engagement in it.

DT asked if the Committee had any further thoughts on the destigmatisation piece and how that might feed into the liberation communities.

DT noted that if anyone had any further thoughts or comments on this topic they'd be welcome to email him.
